Jesus is a King. Jesus is the King.

He really likes being King. So much so, in fact, that he talks about his Kingdom 107 times in Matthew, Mark, and Luke alone!

Perhaps one of the best known passages about Jesus' Kingdom is Matthew 6:33, "**But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.**"

Seek the Kingdom. In this passage, Jesus is teaching about not being anxious and worrying, but instead trusting in His reign. Jesus is in control. Jesus is in charge. Jesus is the King of all creation, the universe, the cosmos. Jesus is King of the past, the present, the future. Jesus is King of our relationships, our emotions, our finances, our health.

This is good news!

That's an understatement. This is *as good as news could ever get*. Jesus is King!

Really, that's the gospel: Jesus is King and his reign is moving in over our fallen world. He's going to revolutionize everything. His Kingdom is invading our lowly planet.

As Christians, we are citizens of Jesus' Kingdom. That means that we as Immanuel are an outpost, a colony of that coming Kingdom. So, if we are a community of Jesus' royal subjects, of course, we would heed Jesus' words and "seek the Kingdom. (Enthusiastically, I might add!) What does this mean? How do we seek the Kingdom?

We Expect It

This should be obvious, but as Jesus' royal subjects, we by definition expect Jesus' reign to move. To have an impact. To change us and change our lives. This means that *we do not bring the Kingdom, but Jesus does*. We are on the receiving end of his reign! Jesus is King of his church. It doesn't matter how much money we have, how many people are in the pews, how good the sermons are, or how beautiful our sanctuary is. If Jesus isn't doing it, it will fail. Miserably. Because, by definition, it's not part of his Kingdom. Being part of the church means trusting Jesus is it's King and he will lead us (even when things don't seem to be going well.) It means trusting Jesus even when we're not doing ministry in the fanciest part of town. It means trusting Jesus when our building isn't ideal. It means trusting Jesus even when we have a vacancy.

We Invest In It

Don't pull out your lounge chairs and fancy drinks just yet (besides, it's January). Just because Jesus is the one responsible for moving the Kingdom doesn't mean we don't do anything. The way Jesus reigns, he uses us. He uses the things of this world to do amazing things. He uses the ordinary to perform the extraordinary. Just like he uses simple water, bread, and wine to produce eternal life, Jesus uses the simple things of our lives in his eternal Kingdom. That means that even though we do not bring the Kingdom, we invest in it. We count on it. We support it. Just like buying stock in a booming business, we give our finances, our time, our vocations to the Kingdom. (*After all, it is the winning side!*) We leverage the power of Jesus' Kingdom to transform this world. Jesus came for inner cities and for outcasts, for communities in trouble and for lives that are broken.

We Engage It

And, if Jesus is really reigning and his Kingdom is really winning, we should engage it. Meet it head on. Participate with it *because* of its power and promise. That means that as Jesus' royal subjects we join Jesus in forgiving sin, restoring lives, comforting the sick, helping the poor, and praying for our enemies. In the BIble and in church we encounter his Word of Promise and Purpose and let it shape us. Let it shape our view of the world. Let it shape what we do in the world. We engage with the reign of Jesus as a real Kingdom, an ultimate authority, and a force to be reckoned with. Get in the Bible and get to church. Engage with your King.

2018 is going to be a big year for Immanuel. Why? Because Jesus is the King of our local church. Brothers and Sisters, that is terrifying and awesome. I can't wait.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Some of you may already be aware that I've been facing some difficult changes this year. If you weren't aware, I pray that you don't feel out of the loop, as I haven't been speaking very freely about it. Please know that it has not been my intention to hide anything from my Immanuel family. Frankly, it's been very difficult to talk about!

I found out last fall that my marriage was over. I have learned a lot through this struggle, and I believe that God has been using this season of life to prepare me to serve His children in a way that I never could have imagined before walking this difficult road. I've chosen to share some of this struggle with each of you, in the hopes that it might lend some insight when you have the opportunity to shine some light in the midst of someone else's darkness.

I think it's safe to say that nearly everyone has been touched by divorce in some way, whether it be in our immediate family, extended family, or a friend. It's one of the many nasty effects of sin in this world. It stinks. It really, really stinks. Not only is there the pain of a broken family, mourning a relationship, navigating all of the finances, property, visitation rights/schedules, blah blah, but there's also dealing with the stigma, and wondering what's going through other people's minds when you mention the 'D' word.

How do you share the news? It's not something to be celebrated, no matter what the circumstances. How do you approach the topic? If *you* bring it up it's weird--are you talking about it because you're proud of it, or because you're looking for sympathy?? If *they* bring it up then they inevitably feel awful! Then there's the fact that nobody ever really knows what to say, especially if they had also been friends with your spouse! Many knee-jerk reactions are to point out all of the flaws of my former spouse, but the fact remains: I chose to marry that man at one point...

Divorce. It stinks. It's not anything I thought I'd have to deal with. All of the social aspects of divorce are annoying, but I think the most detrimental details are all of the things rushing around in your heart and mind: Someone decided that I wasn't worth sticking with. Someone decided that I wasn't worth loving anymore. Someone decided that I wasn't worth being faithful to. Someone decided that I wasn't worth respecting. And then the doubts and killed confidence seep out into your interactions with others. Every time you share with another person that you're *gulp* divorced, it feels like you're shouting "He decided I wasn't worth it!!"

It's like a sliver, way down under the surface of the skin. You can't see it anymore, you can't quite get deep enough to pull it out, and many times you can't even feel it anymore, but poke in just the right spot and OH YEAH, it's still there!!

Satan certainly has a way of creeping in and souring the things we treasure most. Little does he know how doomed he is to fail, though. It's those things we treasure most that cause us to not rely so fully on God. When those things do let us down – God is always there to lift us up and reinstate our incredible value. Our joy, our value, our contentment--why on earth would we rest these things on the *junk of this world*?!?

I am so thankful for the FIRM foundation of faith that I have been given—a gift of the Holy Spirit—nurtured and encouraged by my parents, pastors, friends, family, congregation, and so many others. Without this foundation, I may have given into that lie that I'm not worth it. Without that foundation, I may have given up and decided that I couldn't do it alone. Without that foundation, I may have actually thought that I was alone!

So, the next time that someone shares this sort of awful news with you, acknowledge that it may be good and bad at the same time. Tell them that they are LOVED, they have incredible value, God can still use our sinful brokenness, and Satan is NOT going to win! Then, offer to mow their lawn, or bake some brownies, or something else that they used to rely on their spouse for, because you know what? Divorce stinks!


