Consider Peter's words in 1 Peter 1:4-5.

- Why is creation in "bondage to corruption"? Is Paul talking about human creation or is he including subhuman creation? Why is this significant?
- Why does Paul illustrate our groaning and creation's groaning with the pains of childbirth?
- This hope that we have in Christ is different from the hope that we
 often talk about (I hope I win the lottery). What's the difference in
 the hope that Paul discusses and the hope that we are more
 familiar with in our day to day lives?
