## Easter Aftermath

The appearances of Jesus on Easter and during the following 40 days both confirmed the victory of God and gave all of us who believe the role of sharing the salvation message. 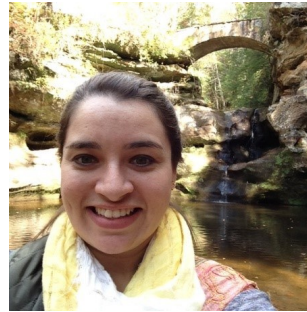

It is the Board's intent that this statement be lived out in every aspect of the conference. ### Mission Statement:
