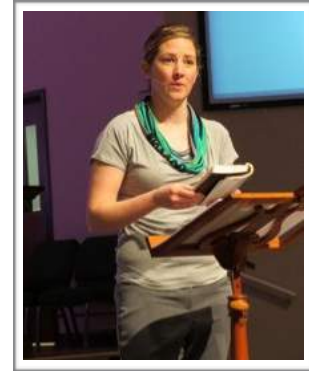

The Story of Eden's Glory

It all began 150 years ago when a group of Methodist ministers came together in upstate New York to be challenged on a variety of social issues, one of which being slavery. Out of that gathering, the Free Methodist church was born. One of the reasons they were called “free” was because they were abolitionists. They believed all people should be free. They believed in holistic freedom – that God wants to set us free physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually.

Fast forward to 2011. Ginger Coakley is now fighting slavery by serving as a team leader in Greenville, Illinois. Faced with a community unaware of trafficking and other injustices in the community, Ginger spearheaded efforts to see a community transformed and in pursuit of a Zero Tolerance [for injustices] Community. Within three years significant engagement has taken place through a team's effort to network, educate, and mobilize a community.



While being birthed out of the Set Free Movement ethos, the work has expanded to the formation of a restoration home for survivors of trafficking called Eden's Glory which is a Christ-centered two-year residential treatment program serving adult women, ages 18 and older. Illinois currently only has 8 beds available to trafficking victims, Eden's Glory will initially add 4 beds to that number. The Set Free Movement and Eden's Glory are partnering with a wide variety of organizations working holistically to pave the way to hope and healing for survivors.

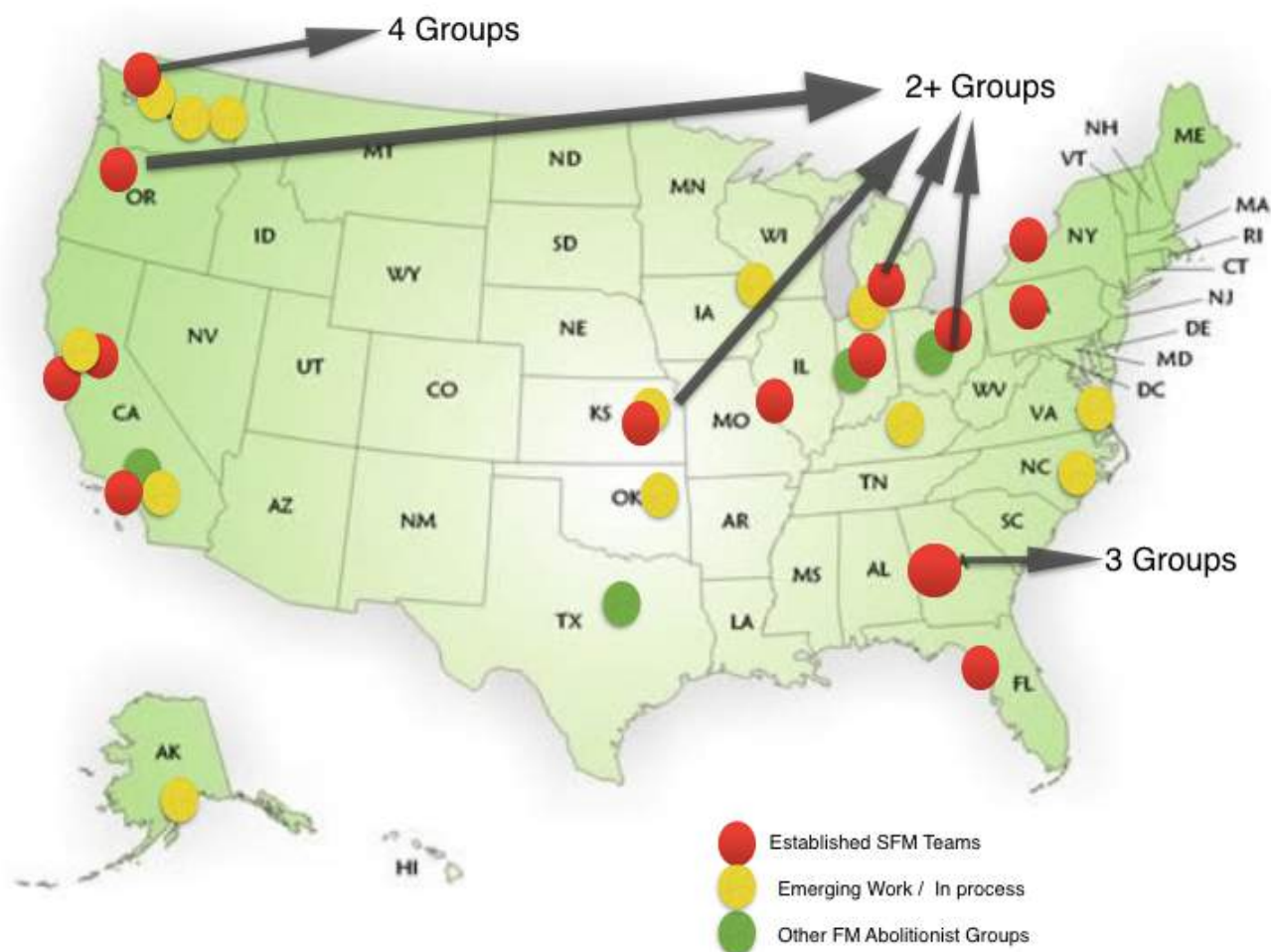

What we do:

- Faithful commitment to integrating Christ into each sector of the program and the daily schedule to assist the women in exploring and developing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.
- We offer life skill and job skill classes through an individualized life plan.
- Provide strength-based, trauma informed care and counseling.
- Assist in providing and developing sustainable long-term housing, employment and a healthy support system.
- Engage community partners in volunteer opportunities.



Eden's Glory is connected to a much broader mission and effort. Here is a snap shot of that work. Beginning September 2013 there were ten Set Free Movement teams operating around the **United States**. Today there are over 30 teams. Additionally, there are international projects in more than a dozen countries, working closely with more than 30 partner organizations. Set Free Movement leaders are helping raise awareness, educate, work with universities, launch safe houses, work directly with modern-day slaves in a variety of contexts, and more.



Eden's Glory is connected to the same type of work (helping set captives free and creating new futures) **internationally**:

- **Philippines, Thailand, India, and Colombia** (International Child Care Ministries)
- **Athens, Greece** (Nea Zoi and Threads of Hope). This work, led by Kali Long, reaches women trapped in sex trafficking and offers hopeful solutions.
- **Taiwan**: working with at risk immigrants, helping prevent abuse and modern slavery.
- **Philippines**: ministering with homeless children and partnering with others to create an assessment center (International Justice Mission).

The Stories

- Annie (pictured right, on the left) is licensed as a clinical social worker. She gave up her full time position as a hospital social worker to devote full time passion and energy to advancing the movement in Bond County. Through her the work expanded, a vision was birthed and a program for survivors established .
- On May 18 we dedicated Eden's Glory, a safe house for women rescued out of sex slavery, to the Lord. This home was purchased by Pat and Cheri (pictured below), who were looking for a



Greenville home for retirement. They heard of our program and asked if Eden's Glory had interest in occupying their home since retirement is many years out. A resounding "YES" was our response. On closing day they told us, "you know we never intend to live here."

- A band of prayer warriors meet every Monday morning at 7am in a local coffee shop to pray forward the community, the movement, and the home. Major advances, i.e. answers to prayer, come during our work day on MONDAYS.

•We began making "Freedom Scarves" from discarded t-shirts as a fundraiser. It became more than a fundraiser as scarf wearers told the story when asked about the scarf and prayed for freedom. We know mountains are being moved as freedom hangs on the necks of many. Additionally we have raised over \$5,000, just \$7 at a time.

- Dona and her mother, Elsie, gave their entire summer and DIY skills to remaking the interior of Eden's Glory. As they painted, sewed, repurposed and decorated-they prayed. Through one prayer they saw a single spool of thread quilt five quilts, hem countless seams on curtains, and run out just as they stitched the last stitch of a decorative touch to the living room curtains. Miracles are already taking place at Eden's Glory!



Opportunities and Challenges Ahead

Phenomenal growth in the past year has pushed us to a new level. It's a vivid reminder to us that it's all about partnerships and transformation. Our community has responded in remarkable ways and God has provided and led clearly and swiftly to the opening of Eden's Glory. In just under a year, we have moved from a vision cast to a home and program ready for occupancy. The need is immense with referrals for our service coming in regularly and **only 8 beds in the State of Illinois to meet this need.**

The Set Free Movement and Eden's Glory pursue smart action, rooted in community, and in partnership with others. Ginger and her team are networked widely with regional and state human trafficking coalitions, and are partnering with a variety of safe homes around the state and country and will continue to strengthen their network.

To do this work we will lean into the challenge of:

1. Investing in additional leaders. People are hearing the call of God to engage, now we need to encourage, empower, and educate these new leaders.
2. Planting an evidence-based successful restoration program.
3. Creating a Social Enterprise to produce a sustainability structure.
4. Advancing the message, creating awareness and garnering support.
5. Raising more money to fund freedom. Our 2014 goal is \$150,000.



Would you consider financially investing into the work? To help guide you, here are three specific areas of need this year.

STAFFING **\$90,000**

- Eden's Glory will start with two full time positions: Program Manager and House Manager; and expanding to one additional part-time position to operate the social enterprise. Estimated annual need: \$90,000

PROGRAM **\$31,500**

- **Curriculum** - We are planning to have a variety of life skills classes which will require books, workbooks, DVD's, etc. Estimated annual needed: \$1500
- **Social Enterprise** - Alongside the program we would like to open a social enterprise to allow for sustainability as well as job skills training. Estimated total needed: \$10k initial start up
- **Transportation** - We are in need of a company vehicle that would seat a minimum of 6 persons. Estimated total needed: \$20,000+ one time

OPERATIONS **\$100,000**

- **Property Expenses** - estimated total needed: \$20k annually
- **Medical Care** - estimated total needed: \$30k annually
- **Living Costs** - estimated total needed: \$10k annually
- **Business and Professional Expenses** - estimated total needed: \$20K annually
- **Other** - \$10K
