INTENERARY

- DAY 1 (Thursday)** Travel to Piedras Negras, Coahuila, Mexico. Piedras Negras is located across the river from Eagle Pass, TX. We will spend the night in our partner Pastor Joe Torres' home.
- DAY 2 (Friday)** Unload the trailer and buying food for the orphanages and various ministries. Visit and minister at 'Bethesda Orphanage" in Piedras Negras. We will stay the night at the 'Casa Hogar Getsemani' orphanage in Morelos (35 miles from Piedras Negras). John & Paulina Bivens are the directors.
- DAY 3 (Saturday)** Minister at 'Casa Hogar Getsemani' and return to Piedras Negras for our ministry at the prison. Saturday night we will participate in a neighborhood children's ministry services. We will stay in Piedras and leave early Sunday morning.
- DAY 4 (Sunday)** Attend church in San Antonio or get an early start home.
