Beloved in Christ,

Merry Christmas!

The business of the new calendar year is upon us once again. The date for our **Annual Congregational Meeting** is set for **Sunday, January 28th**. The meeting is our annual opportunity to stop and consider where we have been, and look forward to where we are going, making some critical decisions about our leadership along that way. On that morning, we will begin with Mattins at 9:00 and then celebrate one Mass at 9:30. Please plan on being in attendance. The occasion is significant enough for us to gather together as one parish family to ask our Heavenly Father's guidance and blessing upon the year ahead. After Mass we will head over to the Great Hall for a bit of continental breakfast before returning to the Church to conduct the business of the meeting.

The Church is God's house. We convene as his People, hopefully, under his guidance, to equip ourselves to better do his will. We are called to glorify him in all that we do and to be his ambassadors to the world around us. So the business of the parish's meeting is actually his business. It is, therefore, meet and right that our meeting take place in the Church.

We are still within the **12 Days of Christmas** until Saturday's celebration of the Epiphany on the 6th. I hope you are still plugging in the lights on your house. It is but one small way of witnessing to the world around us that we do indeed have cause to celebrate! I hope you can be with us on the Epiphany for Mattins & Mass at 9:00am. From what many of you have told me, it has been a very good Christmas season this time around. I am very grateful to all who have given of themselves to make it so; to Susan and the choir for their contributions of music, to the adult servers and the acolytes, to all who turned out to deck the Great Hall, to the Altar Guild who saw to the decoration of the church, and to Tommye, Don and company who organized the Christmas Toast.

It is helpful to keep in mind that we gather to celebrate the Mass to “do” something, not necessarily to “get” something. Get something we do, but the motivation for being there is to give something. Catholic worship consists of the giving of ourselves to God; “our selves, our souls and bodies,” as the Canon of the Mass has it.

Please pray for Karen and me as we travel from the 10th through the 19th. We are going to be a part of a Clergy Familiarization Tour to the Holy Land. All of the pilgrims will be either members of the clergy or their spouses. We have been warned, “This is not going to be a vacation.” The itinerary is packed full of visits to an amazing array of many of the places mentioned in the gospels. I was encouraged by Bishop Iker to make sure that it is indeed a pilgrimage. He was kind enough to give me a dispensation from the annual Diocesan Clergy Retreat in order to make this journey. The goal, beyond visiting the holy places in the Holy Land (*a lifelong dream of mine!*), is to become prepared to return, organize, and to lead another pilgrimage. Does that sound like something that might interest you? Stay tuned. In the mean time, please pray us safely there and home again. Our guide is Fr. David Roseberry, a very experienced Middle East traveler. He and the folks of the tour company are keeping a close watch on events there and with our safety and security in mind. While I am away, Fr. Tom will also be out of pocket, so Fr Kalimi will celebrate the weekday Masses and Fr. Crary will be our Supply Priest on Sunday the 14th.

You are a wonderful parish. It has all been very good indeed and I am most blessed to be here as your priest.
