Pastor's Message Philip Bunch, Associate Pastor

500 Years of Reformation (and still counting)...

When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent" (Mt 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance. [Thesis 1, Martin Luther]

As many of you know and are already celebrating, we approach a great milestone in the life of the Church. This year marks the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther writing the famous "95" Theses" and nailing them to the Wittenberg Castle church door (or really, more like the church bulletin board). You can see the words to the first thesis, or statement-to-defend, above. Luther sets a marked difference against the Catholic Church's teaching on penitence. Instead of an act or action that one performs-presumably under direction of a local priest--Luther maintained that Christ (and the Scriptures) taught a lifestyle of repentance. That's one of the reasons that we will be studying several of the Reformers lives in our Wednesday night Study of God's Providence. It was not an action to be completed, but a life to be lived in submission to God's authority. We continue to celebrate this and many more things that came from the Protestant Reformation. Among them include: the doctrine of justification by faith alone in Christ alone, the Bible in the language of the common people, the reformation and restoration of Biblical worship, the priesthood of all believers.

This is also a busy month in the life of our church. We look forward to spending time in the mountains of North Carolina at our Church-wide Retreat on October 13-15. Please register if you haven't already done so! (individuals: \$75, families: \$100) Near the end of the month, we will host our annual Fall Carnival, which always proves to be a fun time for ALL ages. Join us on Wednesday, October 25 for food and fun and games!

Finally, our church will come together on Reformation Sunday, October 29 to celebrate the history of our church tradition with one special service at 10:00am. Following that service, we will enjoy a time of fellowship with our new members, as well as hearing a report from our Spain mission team. Be sure not to miss out on all of these wonderful ways to celebrate God's faithful care and love in the life of our church family.
