## Dining Hall

- We need a drastic remodel or replacement of the current Administration Building. We are entertaining a few different options for this facility, and likely won't make a full decision for a course of action until we've progressed all the way through Phase I.

- We will continue to find new and fun programming activities. We're researching many options for their cost, training needed, longevity, and fun. These ideas will change and grow as we progress through the vision process (your suggestions are great here).

## How do we get there?

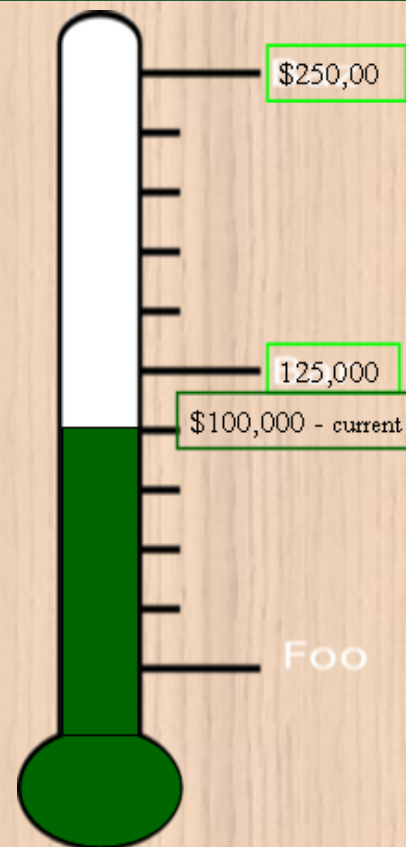

## Phase 1 Kitchen and Restroom Facility
