




Junior High School

The Junior High Ministry at Our Saviour's is focused on educating our youth to learn what it means to belong to a community of faith. Through a variety of lessons and weekly activities - from eating and praying together, to playing games with each other - we explore the foundations and expressions of our relationship with God and one another. Students not only grow in their faith through studying the Bible and the Catechism, but they also learn to find unique expressions of faith through an assortment of ministry opportunities including different music and drama groups. This journey of spiritual growth brings the students to their Confirmation at the end of their eighth grade year.

Schedule Curriculum

When: Sunday afternoons from 12:00 -1:30 pm

Where: Celebration! Campus

This time has proven to be most advantageous for this age group to retain information and stay engaged. Both Large Group and Small Group times are intentionally more brief so as to work within the realistic attention spans of our kids, and to foster a spirit of longing for church, instead of merely seek to "get through" Church.

11:30-12:00 Open Gym

This time of fellowship is offered, not required, to exert some energy and catch up with friends.

12:00-12:40 Opening Large Group

We begin with prayer, announcements and lunch—so come hungry, not only for food but to also to be filled with the Spirit. Then we transition into our Introduction to the day's discussion through media, activity, or illustration before delving into small group time.

12:40-1:20 Small Group Discussion

During this time students dive deeper into the day's discussion and close with prayer. Each small group is lead by an adult mentor and a high school student mentor.

1:20-1:30 Closing Large Group

Students gather back in the gym to review the day's topic and close in prayer.

Surge is a three-year Confirmation program. Each year's material is a different "chunk" of Luther's Small Catechism, the piece of writing that we Lutherans the base of Confirmation. The study of the Catechism has been spread out over three years to make it more accessible and retainable for our students. We use life application, activities, and most of all, small group dialogue to dive into the topics of each week.

2016-17: The Old Testament and the Sacraments

Students will cover different stories throughout the old testament making them real to this current time. Students will also learn what the Sacraments, Baptism and Communion, not only mean to the church but also to themselves.

2017-18: The 10 Commandments and the Apostle's Creed

Students dive into the Ten Commandments and the Apostles Creed, by taking it apart, looking at it in smaller sections helping them to relate it to their lives.

2018-19: The New Testament and the Lord's Prayer

Students will cover different stories throughout the new testament making them real to this current time.

Students will also break apart the Lord's Prayer helping them relate it to their lives







Surge Expectations

In order to complete the confirmation program at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, each student needs to meet the expectations of *each* program year. If, for whatever reason, a certain expectation is not met, the student and parent are expected to speak with us regarding make up material.

Attendance

Students need to attend Surge in order to benefit from the opportunities provided. Attendance is necessary in order to be confirmed.

......

If a student is unable to come on a Sunday afternoon we offer Wednesday night make-ups at the main campus from 5:00-5:45 pm. Either Sunday or Wednesday attendance is required.

If neither of the two days can be attended an absence will be incurred. **Up to six absences are allowed in one school year**. If more than six absences are incurred, steps will be taken with the pastors and youth leaders to make-up missed material.

Special cases are taken into consideration. Please contact the youth leaders.

Sermon Notes

Students are expected to complete 15 sermon notes by the end of May.

Worship response forms to be used for the sermon notes are available near the entrances of the Sanctuary at both campuses.

Completed forms are to be placed in the appropriate bin labeled 6th, 7th, or 8th grade.

A tally count of all of the forms completed for the Ministry year will be made available on the blog (www.oslcyouthministries.com) once a month.

We welcome responses from other religious services or spiritual events as well, as long as there is a clear and genuine effort to reflect one's experience of God in the moment.

Service

Students are expected to fulfill three different service opportunities during the ministry year (September – May).

Service opportunities may include any of the following and are highlighted throughout this catalog: Participating in Praise Express, Praise Bells, or Hearts in Puppetry.

Assisting in worship as a greeter, usher, acolyte, communion server, bible reader, or helping with tech support. Volunteering at events like the Youth Auction, Bud Suds and Grub, Crop Walk, Feed My Starving Children and VBS. Or community service like helping set-up for PADS, raking leaves for elderly or shoveling snow.

There are many opportunities at church, not limited to examples above; however, students are also encouraged to participate in other service opportunities outside of church.

Student—Parent Meeting

Each year before confirmation we have a meeting in order to go over important information about attire, locations and times, faith interviews, and details about the rehearsal dinner and confirmation ceremony. We expect both the student and a parent to attend this meeting because we will cover necessary guidelines for the last part of the confirmation journey.

Bonus Curriculum

During the second semester of the eighth grade year we provide a bonus curriculum for the students to go through as a class, beginning after the student-parent meeting. The eighth grade class will be meeting as a group in the gym each week during small group time. This is a great time for the class to bond as we mix up their groups, helping them to get to know each other. It is also a great time to reinforce what they have already learned throughout their three years in confirmation. It is an expectation that all confirmands will attend every Sunday during this important time before confirmation.

Faith Stories

A part of the confirmation process at Our Saviour's includes the writing of one's *Faith Story*. This is an expression of faith... and just as one's experience of God differs, so too will one's expression of God differ. There is no required format, but there are minimal guidelines. This is intentional, so as to challenge the student to consider the most natural expression of *their* faith. This is not a school project; this is an opportunity to express their faith and what it means to them.

......

Faith Stories may take many shapes, including, but not limited to: a written essay, a poem with an explanation or interpretation, a piece of art, sculpture, photography, painting, drawing, collage, or a scrap book with explanation or interpretation, a song or video, or even a project like a service idea with something written about the plan and experience.

Faith Interviews

Faith interviews are the times when the Youth Team, Pastors and Mentors meet one on one with the confirmands to go over their Faith Stories. This is a very important part of the confirmation process and is required for students to be confirmed. This is a really meaningful time, as we do not get many opportunities to speak one-on-one with your students about their faith and what it means to them to be confirmed.

Confirmation Retreat

Attendance at the Confirmation Retreat in Lake Geneva is mandatory for all 8th graders who are wishing to be confirmed. The retreat will not only give the students a chance to build relationships within their community and give them a chance to begin to form their ideas for their faith stories, but it will also help each student to better understand what will be happening when they get confirmed.

What is Confirmation?

According to the ELCA, They say "Confirmation ministry is a pastoral and education ministry of the church which helps the baptized person through Word and Sacrament to identify more deeply with the Christian community and participate more fully in it's mission." But really what does that mean? On the day you were baptized some promises were made. Parent's and Sponsor's promised to bring you to Church, teach you about Communion, teach you the Ten Commandments and the Creeds, and they also promised to raise you up to know God's love.



Confirmation is more than just a class and it's more than just a three year program. It's a ministry that helps you to find the language to share your faith, to understand what it means to be Lutheran, and helps you to see all the ways that God is active in your life. It's a time to take a closer look at the Bible, baptism, communion, and the teachings of Martin Luther. (He was a really cool guy) The goal is that at the end of all of these classes you will stand before the church, as an adult, and share your faith publicly. Confirmation is a springboard to greater learning and growing in life's faith journey. It's a big step...but it isn't a graduation. Throughout our lives we continue to affirm these promises that were made at our baptism, and we continue to study and learn about God's love, even after we've been confirmed.


What does Confirmation mean?

Senior High School

High School ministries at Our Saviour's ignites our students' faith into action. At Sunday night hang outs, we seek to challenge what the students know, what they believe, and what they question. The curriculum is developed by our Leadership Team, a group of 10-15 students who inform the adult leaders on issues relevant to their lives. Ignition is a time of application and practice, through numerous mission, musical, drama, and service opportunities. From our Sunday night small groups to our international destinations, we always seek to challenge ourselves to grow closer to God and one another, as we explore young adulthood as people of God.

Schedule

When: Sunday Evenings from 6:00-8:00 pm

Where: Celebration! Campus

6:00-6:30 Fellowship and Food

This is a great time for students to reconnect after a long week while eating a light meal and hanging out together in the gym or the youth room.

6:30-6:45 Large Group

Large group is designed to open the day's discussion through media, an activity, or illustration before delving into small group time.

6:45-7:45 Small Group Discussion

During this time students dive deeper into the day's discussion. Each small group has about ten students and is lead by two adult mentors.

7:45-8:00 Prayer and Reflection

An ongoing tradition has been to close in prayer by candlelight in the gym after small group. This is a great time to reflect on what the students have learned and to come together in community in prayer.

Curriculum

The topics and themes addressed throughout the year are planned and developed by a Leadership Team made up of about 10-15 of our most involved students, and we are in constant pursuit of new ways to challenge ourselves to reach out and explore what it really looks like to live out our faith in the lives we lead. Some topics in the past have included things from eschatology, relationships, and vocations to drugs and alcohol.

Baccalaureate

Baccalaureate is a wonderful tradition where seniors in high school are honored and recognized for their achievements and value at church. During the 10:30 worship service, blankets for the graduates are blessed by the pastors and given to the seniors by their parents. After the service the seniors are served lunch followed by a program. This day helps bring together many memories for the graduating seniors and allows parents, friends, and staff to say how important these students were to the life of Our Saviour's.

Service, Events, Trips, Missions and MORE!

There are many opportunities for students to get involved through events at the local bowling alley, missions trips both locally, and internationally, to choir trips and ski trips! All are wonderful opportunities to grow in faith and build lasting relationships with friends from all over!

Haiti Missions Trip

Why Haiti

In 2011, we took our high school group to Haiti for the first time. We did not go, we do not go, and we will not go because the Haitians need our help. This has been a very important detail to emphasize from the beginning of this program as there are plenty of strong and resourceful Haitian people equipped to rebuild and move forward within their country. Our task, on the other hand, is to build relationships. Though we have moved many bricks and poured many buckets of concrete over the years, our time there has had less to do with the walls being built and much more to do with the relationships. If one of our students from Our Saviour's comes home with a joyfully teary-eyed story about a child and a name and a face that they've fallen in love with, then our trip was worth the investment. If one of our students comes home and, months later, sees a newspaper article about the "poor people" in Haiti and is moved to wonder "But, what about the hope I saw? This is not the Haiti I know..." then our trip was a success. If one of our brothers or sisters comes home and is motivated to live out a change in the world in their career or vocation, then our work was worth all the while. We go to Haiti to behold God and love in a new context, and to see how it shapes our lives in the decisions we make ahead.

What we do in Haiti

Our work is divided into two general areas: Construction and Community.

In the mornings, we will mostly clean rubble and debris. Depending on how much money is raised by the congregation for the construction, we will be doing some building in the area as well.

In the afternoons, we focus on community outreach. Most of this will take place at the church and/or orphanages. We spend time doing crafts, games, songs and sharing in fellowship with the kids.

How we fund the trip

This trip, unlike others, is funded by sponsorship. Not having to pay for the trip with their own money creates a certain level of responsibility that the students have toward the community that supports them. This is similar to what takes place during a fundraiser: students are expected to contribute to the fundraiser by washing cars, or soliciting donations. However, in a fundraiser, the end goal is funds. With this ministry model, students will work to foster a supporting relationship with a family in the congregation by attaining sponsors to offset the cost.




When we were first driving through Haiti, I was speechless. Garbage lined the streets and filled up open fields. Wild pigs and dogs were running around everywhere. All I wanted to do was sit and cry because I felt so bad for the conditions they were living in. Luckily one of the chaperones

at it differently. She told me to watch how happy the Haitians are with what little they do have. She told me to watch and learn from their hope and faith, and to let it change me. I'm so glad she gave me this advice because I took in the week with a completely different attitude filled with positive thoughts.

The church of Mariani welcomed us like they had known us all for years. They let us sit in the front during the church service while others had to sit outside the tent due to lack of seats. All the kids greeted us with big smiles and welcoming hugs. I don't think I have ever given so many piggy back rides in one week. While we were working on the church, people from the neighborhood would come to watch, and many would step in and help us. We had so much fun while working that I can't even call it work. Getting to spend time with the kids from the community at the end of each day was a very eve opening experience as well. I learned that you don't need language to have a relationship with someone. I didn't exchange a single word with some of the people I met, but they impacted me in such a great way, I know I will never forget them.

When I got home, the first thing everyone asked me was, "Did you help the Haitians?" But what they didn't understand was that I did nothing to help the Haitians make their current situation better because they didn't need it. The life they live is simple and beautiful, and it makes me sad that people think they need to change that. They helped me see life in a whole new way. The faith they have in God and in each other is all they need and I am so glad I got to experience their faith. I think people have the wrong mentality of what we go to Haiti to do. We don't go to "fix" their country or to pity their situation. We go to learn from these people who are kind and loving to complete strangers. We go to build relationships and be taught what it truly means to be a Christian. The Haitians put their faith before anything and I really learned from that. We didn't need a language to worship the same God or to even talk to each other because our love for each other is bigger than words.

The first High School class in Martin will have 51 students! We continue to be part of their vision of growth and will be offering new opportunities for student exchanges/host families; specialized opportunities to teach English, sports and music at the High School as well as hopefully returning in the summer of 2020. Children's Ministry



Feed My Starving Children

Feed My Starving Children is a non-profit Christian organization committed to feeding God's children hungry in body and spirit. The approach is simple: children and adults hand-pack meals specifically formulated for malnourished children, and we ship the meals to nearly 70 countries around the world. Our Saviour's and churches from around the area get together to have a mobile packing event every year that allows our congregations to pack life -giving meals. In 2012, more than 177,000 MobilePack volunteers packed over 41 million meals, with 204 events in over 30+ states.

PADS

Over the past 27 years, DuPage Pads has moved from just managing homelessness to actually treating the whole person and providing a solution to end homelessness. Everyone, including the youth, can all do something incredible by working together to offer these people hope and possibility. Crosswalk

The Crosswalk is an interactive journey to Jerusalem with Jesus and his friends. The event is for families and children of all ages. Those participating in the Crosswalk are getting to "tell" part of the greatest story ever told by acting out events from the Easter story! They get to share the story of Jesus and his friends from Jesus' journey to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to the day he was crucified. They equip the parents to tell the rest of the story – and encourage everyone to celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday!

Service Opportunities

Baby Care Ministry

Baby Care at Our Saviour's is both a global and local mission that serves the youngest in need by collecting and distributing gently used clothing and other essentials to under resourced babies. Last year we shared over 3,000 baby items with agencies right here in DuPage County and assembled 550 Baby Care Kits to be distributed through Lutheran World Relief (LWR). These kits are used for refugee relief and as part of prenatal health care initiatives aimed at reducing infant mortality. Students can help throughout the year in many ways and at flexible times. Join us to shop resale, find great bargains, and sort clothing. We wash all of our gently used clothing before sharing it with our families. Help us cut pieces out of flannel sheets to make baby diapers. Finally, we always need help on the last weekend of September to move boxes out of storage and to set up clothing for our Baby Care Kit assembly parties at both campuses.



Leadership Opportunities

Leadership Team

Leadership Team is exactly what it sounds like; it is a group of students that meet weekly and have a small group setting where discussions that involve decision making in the church community are made. It is a great way to be a leader and have your voices heard. Making decisions that involve the different trips and activities that should or should not be put into action really teach the students that they can make a difference in the lives of their peers. Students can also give feedback about what is going on in Ignition and help decide what topics we discuss on Sunday evenings.

Leadership Team meets on Wednesday evenings from 5:45 to 6:45 pm. Our first meeting of the year will be on Wednesday, August 17. If you are interested in joining the team this year, contact Bobbi.

Surge Mentors

Being a mentor of Sure is a unique opportunity for confirmed high school students to share their faith with eager junior high school students. Student mentors are paired with an adult mentor and join a group of students. Both adult mentors and student mentors walk along side the students as we learn about and discuss the confirmation curriculum. Being a mentor to Surge is an important job and takes commitment, but it is highly rewarding. Surge meets on Sundays from 12:00-1:30 pm.

Leadership Lab

Leadership Lab is designed to assist youth acquire skills that will be useful in congregational, synod, and national youth ministry settings and in their local communities and the world. Each level of Lab is structured to help participants progress in their ability to be responsible youth ministry leaders and help them grow in their awareness of God, self, and others. The camp is held at Augustana College in Rock Island, Illinois.

Participants must have completed the 8th grade before going. Participants must complete the previous lab level before moving to the next level (i.e. must complete Basic before Advanced, Advanced before Phase 3). However, no previous lab experience is necessary to attend Phase 3 for those who are entering their junior or senior year of high school.

Leadership Lab is an intense week of study, worship, and building relationships. The participants spend from 8:30 am-11:00 pm each day in small and large group gatherings, planning, learning, prayer, and discovering where they are in their faith journey.

While very spiritually rewarding, the week can be stressful and difficult. Participants need to know this ahead of time so that they can prepare themselves for this type of an experience.

Leadership Lab is offered as a resource for the students but, it is not considered an Our Saviour's "youth trip." However, it is highly encouraged for the students to attend.



Part of what I love about being a Surge Mentor is when I am able to get through to the kids and help them grow in their faith. It is really cool to watch them learn more, because I know that we, as mentors, are making a difference. Since we've already been through it, we can relate to exactly what the kids are going through. I like seeing the progress that the kids make, because I know they are learning more and more about their faith every week.
