#### Parent – Teacher Conferences this Week

This is a chance for each child to participate in evangelism, to be involved in Miramonte's core value of service.

## **Olweus in Practice (the Bullying Prevention Program)**

During our third grade Olweus meetings, we have been talking about respect and being sensitive. Being sensitive can be thinking of others, getting involved in a helpful way, or telling the truth even when it's hard. Being sensitive also can mean watching for changes in verbal and non-verbal communication. For example, if a group is playing keep-away, you should watch faces and listen for tone changes in their voices so you can tell when the game stops being fun and becomes teasing.

Showing respect can mean not laughing when you see something different or telling the truth in a gentle way. During role-play, we practiced how to interrupt a conversation that is turning into gossip and what to do if we saw the ball tag someone out and they didn't leave the game. Students were gentle and gave others the benefit of the doubt instead of calling names or accusing them of cheating, since we all know that sometimes we don't feel the ball hit our shoes or clothes. Being sensitive and respectful helps to keep our school a safe environment.
